MAYOR'S REPORT -

Mayor Larry reported on the following issues that were brought before Mayor & Council at Monday nights work session: 1) Blackbird problem on Travelers Rest Rd – This is an ongoing problem and Chief Finch is working on a legal solution to the problem. 2) Junk cars – letters have been sent to offenders giving 30 days to remove junk cars or face the city court judge. 3) Dogs on McKaskal St. – Animal Control Officer picked up 2 dogs in question and set trap for third dog. 4) Charlie Marshall property on Travelers Rest Rd – both rental houses are hooked to the same sewer line. Years ago when sewer service was requested, the City Manager, Larry Clark, authorized both houses to be connected to same sewer line due to fact that City sewer line was so deep and major roadwork would have to occur. Each house does have a separate water meter. 5) Drug deals on Travelers Rest Rd – Illegal drugs are prevalent not only city-wide but state and nation wide. Tips from the community can greatly enhance the city's ability to fight the drug problem. 6) Employee tongue ring – employee referred to has been instructed to remove tongue ring while working.

Mayor Larry also reported on the annual Summer Camp for kids to be held at Camp John Hope during the week of June 25th through June 30th, 2006. Each year Mayor Larry contacts old military buddies and solicits funding for his important youth projects. To date, the Youth Development League has awarded over \$37,500 in scholarships to top students in Macon County. All funds come from donations. Mayor Larry has been spearheading the Youth Development League for 23 years and is looking for a successor to carry on the

mission of the League to provide leadership learning opportunities to Macon County's youth.
